Accident Takes Life of Former Resident Heard G. McCormick.

Heard G. McCormick, longtime resident of Fredonia and vicinity, died last Friday morning while enroute to Kanab hospital from the scene of a truck-bus collision approximately three and a half miles north of Jacob Lake.

Eyewitness reports state that McCormick, an employee of the Arizona State highway department, was proceeding north on the road in a state owned truck when his vehicle was struck from the rear by a Utah Parks bus driven by Fred S. Mathley Ogden. The impact threw the Arizona truck off the road and overturned it, tossing out the injured man. The bus continued down the highway for more than 500 feet and came to a stop.

A nurse from the bus administered immediate first aid and was joined in a few minutes by Effie Dean Rich and Afton Bowman, trained nurses who were called from Jacob Lake. Dr. Phillip G. Fulstow arrived from Kanab as soon as possible, an ambulance was improvised from a pick up truck driven by John Rich, and the injured man, accompanied by Dr. Fulstow and Mrs. Rich, was rushed toward the hospital. However, he succumbed from severe head injuries before the state line was reached.

Heard McCormick was born on October 16, 1894, in Georgia. He first came to this area in 1921 and had worked on a number of historic construction jobs in and around the region, notably Grand Canyon lodge and the Colorado bridge at mouth of Bright Angel canyon. He had a host of friends and acquaintances throughout northern Arizona and southern Utah. In Fredonia he made his home at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Altus Jenson.

Late Friday evening more than 70 of McCormick's friends gathered at the Jenen (*sic*) home for commemorative services prior to shipment of the body to Georgia for burial. Bishop Allen Judd opened with a short prayer. A quartette, Mesdames Ray Judd, Myron Brown, John Brooksby and Morris Judd, sang "Abide With Me", favorite hymn of the deceased. Thomas Jenson presented a memory of the McCormick he had known, describing him as one who was "a foster father to all the children of the community and a member of the family of all his scores of friends." Leroy Judd sang "tis no Secret," and the services closed with the Masonic prayer read by Eli Shelton. The singers were accompanied at the piano by Miss Winona Peterson, Kanab.

Pallbearers were Bill Byron, Barney Burch, Darrell Lathim, Robert Wright, Ray MacBride and Slim Lathim.

The deceased is survived by two brothers, Buel McCormick of Jacksonville, Florida, and Carl McCormick of Cumming, Georgia, in which community he will be buried.

A tragic death that shocked this whole community and caused widespread grief was that of Mrs. Olen (Nina Tollison) Merritt, 60, who was fatally injured about 7:45 last Wednesday night when a stray mule ran out of the darkness, jumping the roadside gutter into the automobile in which Mrs. Merritt was riding with Mrs. C.C. Black of Peavine community, and Miss Vicki Rickett, Catoosa County Home Demonstration Agent, owner of the car, who was driving. Mrs. Merritt was the wife of Postmaster Olen N. Merritt, and was herself assistant postmaster, and was a prominent and beloved church woman and civic leader.

The accident occurred on State Highway 53, just off 41, and six miles beyond Calhoun, on the short route to Gainesville via Fairmount. The women were returning from an all-day district meeting of home demonstration club leaders at the University of Georgia in Athens. It is said that it was evident by tracks approaching the scene of the collision and wreck that the mule was running as it came out and collided with the moving car, smashing in the right side, landing on top, and was killed. Mrs. Merritt was riding in the right side of the front seat, and Mrs. Black was in the back seat. Out of control, the car ran some distance further and crashed into a roadside bank. The mule was said to have belonged to a Resaca resident, several miles away.

The car was crashed into and about Mrs. Merritt's head. A Calhoun ambulance carried her to Johnson Hall Hospital in Calhoun, but she was dead upon arrival. The body later that night was brought to the Wallis and Bomar Funeral home here.

Mrs. Black suffered a broken ankle and severe cuts and bruises, while Miss Rickett suffered from shock, but received only slight cuts and bruises. Her late model car was badly damaged.

Mrs. Merritt was a member of the Baptist Church, the Order of the Eastern Star, the American Legion Auxiliary, the Ringgold Civinette Club, the Garden Club, the Home Demonstration Club, the T.E.L. Sunday School class, and was an active worker in these and various religious and civic groups.

The Merritts are both natives of Forsyth County, Georgia, coming to Ringgold about 30 years ago. For a number of years Mrs. Merritt was assistant cashier of the Bank of Ringgold. She will be sadly missed in the community.

Albert S. Hardy Sr., 80-year-old former president of the National Editorial Association, passed away Tuesday, May 12, at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta after an illness of seven weeks. He was admitted to the hospital on May 8.

A native of Jasper County, Mr. Hardy attended Gordon Institute at Barnesville and purchased the Gainesville News in 1897 after working on the Macon Telegraph and the Atlanta Constitution.

Working with his brother, James Broughton Hardy, and his three sons, Albert, Jr., Milton and Charles, he built the News into one of the state's outstanding weeklies. His brother now is editor of the Thomaston Times. Albert Jr., is owner of the Commerce News, while Milton and Charles still are connected with the Gainesville News.

Mr. Hardy was a pioneer member of both the Georgia Press Association and the NEA. For a span of 20 years he never missed an annual convention of the latter. He was president of the Georgia group in the early part of the century and headed the NEA in 1943, the only Southerner ever to hold the presidency of this national organization of weekly newspapers.

Active in civic and political affairs Mr. Hardy has been chairman of the Gainesville board of education; president of the Chamber of Commerce; president of the Rotary Club; and served as postmaster in Gainesville from 1918 through 1934.

He was chairman of Hall County Democratic Committee several times and served as chairman of the state Democratic Executive Committee.

In 1936, James A. Farley appointed him National Chairman of the State Democratic Executive Committee and chairman of the Georgia Presidential Electors. He served as chairman of the North Georgia College Board of Trustees for many years. After the Trustees were supplanted by the Board of Regents, he served two terms as a Regent.

During the past two years he served as vice president of the Hall County Hospital Authority.
